Restrictions on entry to Anacla

The current Covid-19 Public Health Crisis puts a responsibility of all of us to protect ourselves, our communities, our elders and our family members. New public health information, direction and guidance is being made available regularly to guide us in doing so.

Huu-ay-aht law already protects public health. The Huu-ay-aht Land Act s. 50 establishes that no one is permitted to do anything on Huu-ay-aht Treaty Lands that may constitute a danger to public health.

Indigenous and remote communities are recognized to be particularly vulnerable to the current Covid-19 crisis. At this time, entry to Anacla must be restricted to protect public health. In order to protect public health, entry to non-residents will be limited to those:

- a. Providing essential services to the community **AND**
- b. Who do not likely pose a danger to public health

We ask that all those who do not meet these criteria, stay home for now.

If you do think you meet these criteria, you will be screened for public health safety before entry is permitted. We encourage you to review the screening questions before you come, and be prepared to answer them. You will be met at a checkpoint and the screening will be discussed with you.

The confidentiality and use all information collected by Huu-ay-aht First Nations from individuals in order to determine whether their entry into or use of Treaty Lands may constitute a danger to public health will be protected in accordance with Huu-ay-aht law.

Screening Tool

This screening tool is adapted from the Provincial Covid-19 screening tool available through the Centre for Disease Control.

1) Are you experiencing any of the following:

- Severe difficulty breathing (e.g. struggling to breathe or speaking in single words)
- Severe chest pain

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- Having a very hard time waking up
- Feeling confused
- Losing consciousness

YES: Call 911 Immediately; **Contact HFN Health department for assistance if required;**
No Entry to Anacla at this time.

NO: Next questions

2) Are you experiencing any of the following:

- Mild to moderate shortness of breath
- Inability to lie down because of difficulty breathing
- Chronic health conditions that you are having difficulty managing because of difficulty breathing

YES: Consult Family Doctor or Nurse Practitioner; **Contact HFN Health department for assistance if required;** **No Entry to Anacla at this time.**

NO: Next Questions

3) Are you experiencing any of the following:

- Fever (This may be taken at the checkpoint with thermometers)
- Cough
- Sneezing
- Sore throat

AND

- Muscle aches/fatigue
- Sore Throat
- Headache
- Loss of appetite
- Chills
- Runny nose
- Nausea and vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Loss of sense of smell/taste

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YES: Self-Isolate; **Contact HFN Health department for assistance if required**; **No Entry to Anacla at this time**

NO: Next Questions

4) Have you travelled to any countries outside Canada (including the United States) within the last 14 days?

YES: Self-Isolate; **Contact HFN Health department for assistance if required**; **No Entry to Anacla at this time.**

5) Did you provide care or have close contact with a person with COVID-19 (probable or confirmed) while they were ill (cough, fever, sneezing, or sore throat)?

YES: Self-Isolate; **Contact HFN Health department for assistance if required**; **No Entry to Anacla at this time.**

NO: Next Questions

6) Did you have close contact with a person who travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days who has become ill (cough, fever, sneezing, or sore throat)?

YES: Self-Isolate; **Contact HFN Health department for assistance if required**; **No Entry to Anacla at this time.**

NO: Entry to Anacla may be permitted subject to meeting the following conditions:

- a. Provide information to enable Contact Tracing
- b. Physical Distancing
- c. Hygiene measures

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- **The Contact Tracing requires answering the following questions:**

A. Upon Entry:

1. Who will you be seeing? (please fill out)

2. Have you, in the last 14 days, been closer than 2 meters from another person?

i. Who?

Family/co-residents: Is it a closed unit, or have family/co-residents been within 2 meters of other people?

- a. If closed unit: ok
- b. If they don't know: **No Entry to Anacla at this time**
- c. If not: **No Entry to Anacla at this time**

B. Upon Departure:

1. Who did you have contact with? (please fill out)

2. Did you follow the physical distancing and hygiene measures required (below)?

- **Physical Distancing required while in Anacla:**

- a. Stay 2 meters apart
- b. Do not visit people in enclosed spaces—ensure ventilation

- **Hygiene practices required while in Anacla, as recommended by public health authorities, including:**

- a. Hand washing in accordance with public health directives
- b. No physical contact
- c. Wear a mask around elders and anyone with known health conditions

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
