

HUU-AY-AHT COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY PLAN

From November 2020 to March 2021, Citizens participated in a second round of engagement about our CCP. We are now in the process of organizing everything that Citizens shared into the first draft of HUU-AY-AHT's CCP.

A COMMUNITY-DRIVEN PLAN

This round of engagement gathered input and ideas from a range of Citizens' experiences. Executive Council members, the Ha'wiih Council, and over 200 Citizens were all part of the conversation through a survey, engagement sessions, and interviews.

ANCIENT SPIRIT, MODERN MIND

Citizens emphasized a desire to "bring people home", both physically and culturally. Participants emphasized the importance of access to education, training, housing, and culture, both on and off the hahuu'i. For all aspects of HUU-AY-AHT society – education, employment, economy, natural resources, housing, wellbeing, culture, and governance – Citizens shared ideas that capture the Nation's Ancient Spirit and Modern Mind.




WHAT WE HEARD

The chart to the right shows the topics that survey respondents ranked as most important to see progress in over the next 10 to 20 years.

Citizens shared broad ideas of how to progress, including:

- provide more educational and training opportunities, as well as increased learning from Elders;
- fill jobs on the hahuuḷi with members and support skill-building off the hahuuḷi;
- establish a strong tourism industry, while diversifying the economy;
- balance harvesting and conserving Huu-a-y-aht's abundant natural resources;
- have housing support for Citizens where they live and support for those to move to the hahuuḷi;
- increase support for Citizens' physical and mental wellbeing;
- provide opportunities to connect to culture together and remotely; and
- maintain traditional governance, while enhancing modern governance.

The CCP will compile and organize Citizen's ideas and priorities and layout a path to create the type of society that our Nation seeks to achieve.
