Responsibilities	
1) Representing government in relations with other governments.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In terms of representing Huuayaht government in relation with other governments, I continue to remain optimistic we'll meet the Premier in June to discuss Project Green. The Huu-ay-aht Project Green team has informed and continues to be in contact with high level provincial government officials.• According to Councilor Edward Johnson, progress on Oomiqsuu funding negotiations is going very well. Funding for construction of building and operating funds for the Mother Center are secured.• I participated in the MTNA meeting with the Premier on May 24, 2022. A pathway to implementing a Shared Priority Framework is well underway; this is very exciting opportunity to advance HFN priority issues.• In terms of representing Huuayaht government in relations with federal government we are pursuing the following issues:<ul style="list-style-type: none">a) DFO Crab License Transfer will happen in September.b) Me Too issue is top priority and working on strategy to begin advancing the issue at the MFN and federal level in June.c) In regard to Section 87 of the Indian Act, MFN, MTNA and SGIG are pursuing a 50 year extension of MFN FA 19.5.1.b. I've mandated this as a priority for our team.d) Right to fish and to sell fish in terminal fishing areas as per MFN FA 10.3 and 10.5 continues to be work in progress and priority issue.
2) Representing government in relations with other indigenous organizations.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In terms of representing Huu-ay-aht government with other Indigenous organizations, Rob and I continue to pursue MOU agreements or Letter of support for Project Green from 25 First Nations. Mission Accomplished.• Continue to represent Huuayaht at NTC, UBCIC, BCAFN and AFN.

Housing and Infrastructure Overview

- Attended ACRD housing workshop. Overall, was a very informative workshop on the housing crises and shortage in BC. Topics discussed were 1) CMHC Affordable Housing solution- BC assessment and how it's done and 2) Tofino Housing Corporation-What are they trying to do with the shortage of housing and staff housing.
- There is work being done in Upper Anacla with the new subdivision.
- The Bamfield Road contract was finalized on June 22, 2022.
- Attended weekly Road meetings.
- Mother Centre approval of budget on June 2, 2022.
- Attended First Nations Housing Infrastructure Council webinar.
- Attended road meetings with Hazelwood.
- Attended a Housing legislation overview meeting with Canada - asked Jim Lee to attend as it was with Deputy Ministers.

Progress on Key Initiatives:

- New Motors were purchased for the Nutchcoa (Fisheries Boat).
- Culture Center - updated plans for the outside look. New drawings fit the look of the surrounding areas better to go with other structures.
- Attended Hawaii Community Development Presentation by Jim Lee- very informative. Included in the meeting were EC, SMT, HGB, and staff. The three top priorities moving forward are: Education and Training, Quality Housing, Safe and Healthy Community.
- Work is being done by the House of Huu-ay-aht and the AGO office cleaning up the area of wooded debris and expanding the parking lot.
- The Mother Centre is being put out for tender - looking at possible contractors in the near future.
- A spot has been designated for trailers behind House of Huu-ay-aht. Sewer and water have been put in. This area will be designated for worker accommodations.
- West Coast trail cabin - new plans are being designed.
- Bamfield Road work will start June 27, 2022.
- Bamfield Road Signage has been put up on both ends of the road by Hazelwood.
- Bamfield Road kilometer signs were ordered - they look amazing.

Emerging Issues:

- The 9 lots were rejected at land title office due to time restrictions on a signature. They have been submitted for approval.

- Public Works Superintendent and Capital Project Lead jobs were posted - hoping to receive applicants to be able to assist Director of Infrastructure to reduce workload and streamline projects.
- A new school bus needs to be purchased before September 2022 - the current one is too small for the number of children accessing. Bus options are being explored.
- Catalytic converters are still being stolen off our vehicles.
- A playground still needs to be purchased for the Upper Anacla subdivision.
- Bamfield Road contract took too long to finalize, costing us valuable time. WFP/Moasic caused a delay with signing the contract for work to be done on these areas of the road.
- It has been a challenge to obtain gravel through HGB, this needs to be addressed

- Cooperative Management Board – Prepped for meeting for June 23rd. Our Huu-ay-aht team had a lot of updates for this meeting. A lot of time and work went into collecting information to present to Parks Canada.

Progress on Key Initiatives:

- The Alliance meeting with Premier Horgan went very well. I was the representative for our Nation. The Premier and his Ministers agreed to consult with Modern Treaty Nations when working on the shared priorities framework and the action plan. They committed to a better working agreement.
- Treaty Implementation Committee meeting went well. It was more of an introduction meeting getting everyone up to date on what Crystal and I have been up doing. Next committee meeting was booked.
- I have been designated the official rep for the Joint Fisheries Committee (JFC).
- MeToo - A lot of traction has started internally and externally. We are able to apply to move our crab license in September from East to West Coast. – confirmed with Lisa at Ratcliff that she will do the work to apply for the move when it comes up.

- Maa-Nulth Wildlife Committee- Ron Frank interim chair while Christine G off on leave.
- CMB- Kiixin plaque ceremony – date changed to September.

Lands and Zoning

- Attended a meeting about possibly changing some properties and zoning them under a different title.
- Looking into zoning some of the Sarita Lake areas to designated campsites and recreation areas
- We have changed the plans of the new BC Housing that will start later this year – will be putting new housing closer to ball field. Paperwork to be submitted next week.

Other Duties/Tasks Outside of Portfolio

- Attended a salmon derby planning meeting.
- Attended a HIRMP meeting.
- Personal Committee – Had a few committee meetings this past month.
- Tribunal - Attended Tribunal for a few days to show a presence from Executive Council.

- Attended a meeting with H&K to discuss Income tax and property tax. We are trying to find a way to get an extension on sec 87. Meeting went well - waiting for a response back.
- Attended Indigenous Day Celebrations and assisted Councillor Edward Johnson with the canoe. Huu-ay-aht paddled our canoe from Clutsie Marina to attend the event. We were invited by a neighboring nation. It was a great success!
- Development Capital Raise – Working on two task forces with Parks Canada:

1) Cape Beal Headlands Trail Upgrade Task Force

Attended 4 meetings this month and several internal meetings with our team. Work has started regarding trail upgrades and identifying the types of trails we currently have and would potentially like to see. Now we are identifying lands and who owns them on a map. The work has been going well and will continue until September.

2) Land Transfer Working Group

Attended 3 meeting so far with a lot of internal dialog back and forth within our team. We will be briefing Parks Canada with a presentation and our potential plans after they sign NDA. I feel this working group is going well but will be easier once Parks Canada knows what we really have planned for these parcels of lands we want.

Overall, it was a very busy month for me. I am happy to serve as a member of council for our citizens.

- Nananiiqsu meeting - Nananiiqsu would like to bring back the annual gala/fundraiser in December. The Nananiiqsu currently has no form of transportation to be able to go to and from the homelands, on field trips or for outings in general. Nananiiqsu would like to ask HFN to put in the budget for next year. Our elders would like to go on a field trip the weekend of July 23rd – this is the weekend as the cultural camp at Diana Island
- EC Monthly Update - Robert & Edward
- Working on Kw'umut Lelum Protocol Framework - hoping to bring to EC before September.
- Working on a five-week training workshop for our frontline workers on how to address sexual violence and abuse in our community - hoping to bring to EC in July.
- Workshop Restoring Wellness in Our Community: Addressing the Root Causes of Addiction was cancelled for the second time very disappointed. This workshop was going to be for Executive Council and Senior Management, to help us understand what this is doing to our people and our neighboring families. The workshop shares the relationship between trauma, colonization, and addictions in relation to the issues prevalent in Indigenous communities. It provides a working knowledge and history of addictions and related issues including positive actions taken by many Indigenous

communities and organizations to deal with addictions. It also examines the impacts of trauma that increase the alcohol and drug abuse in our communities along with the harmful behaviors and neglect that occurs. A discussion on intergenerational trauma, abandonment and shame assists participants to further understand the dynamics in Indigenous communities today. Lateral violence is discussed as one of the outcomes of trauma and addictions. The workshop closes with an understanding of what strategies the community can implement to restore culture and wellbeing.

The workshop can include the impacts of the current pandemic and how it may increase addictions and unhealthy behaviors.

Council Report for John Alan Jack

May and June 2022

Note to Reader:

Finance – Progress Report

- The finance committee met May 19th and June 16th, 2022.

Finance has been meeting regularly and discussing general topics and reports. We are receiving reports from the Executive Director on the review of the HR regulation and the organization as a whole. Progress there is slower than expected, but still trundling on.

Finance – Emerging Issues

Of the two items from last report, the preparation for the audit and determining how HFN audit practices will affect our various HUU-AY-AHT bodies like HGB, HUUMIIS VENTURES LP, HFN FORESTRY CONSULTING SERVICES LP, and even TSAWAK-QIN FORESTRY (TFL 44) LP. The issue is specifically how Public Sector requirements interact with private enterprise where HUU-AY-AHT is either a partial owner or in full control. Our investments in TFL 44 through a special investment body is the chief concern here.

Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District – Progress Report

The ACRD has held two Board Meetings per month like clockwork, and the agendas and notes and video recordings of those meetings can be had at www.acrd.bc.ca in addition to Committees of the Whole and regional committee meetings.

Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District – Emerging Issues

The previous emerging issue remains. Potentially entering into an agreement with the ACRD to provide planning, zoning and other land-use services until we can ramp up our capacity given the Bamfield road improvement. With the advent of an improved road to Bamfield, we will see an increasing need to contemplate rezoning, variances, temporary use permits and the like as our citizens and residents start building their work and their lives on our lands.

Another issue has emerged regarding the issues that Bamfield seems to have regarding the high costs of their fresh water sourcing as the per capita cost of getting water to Bamfield is quite significant.

Climate Change – Progress Report

I am unsure as to the status of this file as an actual portfolio file. There are items that have been moving forward – mostly grants that we were successful in achieving, but there isn't a committee convened at the moment.

Huumiis Ventures LP and HFN Forestry Consulting Services LP – Progress Report

Meetings were had with Paul Fripp from BDO regarding the Audit that will be upcoming. There will be a need for continued interface with WFP's finance staff to ensure that we can make this process less painful for HFN's holdings. In addition, we have engaged with Grant Thornton for more financial help regarding a more-sophisticated budget. As of this report, the audit is being undertaken now and should be complete by the end of June 2022.

Huumiis Ventures LP and HFN Forestry Consulting Services LP – Emerging Issues

We need to have a discussion at Council about how HFN Forestry Consulting Services is going to be used moving forward. Some of the work being done there seems to bleed over into what's being done at the HFN end of things, and so on and so forth.

HFN Personnel Committee – Progress Report

We have had two meetings and several informal check-ins over the past two months: May 17th and June 10th were the proper meetings. There's an item to discuss next steps on the agenda for June 30th.

HFN Personnel Committee – Emerging Issues

Finding a group or individual to facilitate an evaluation process for our Executive Director has been immensely difficult, I have had conversations with several prospects now and they have all passed on the option.

External Relations – Progress Report

There has been several meetings regarding external relations with Robert, representatives from H&K Vancouver and Ottawa. We've recently planned a meeting to go into more detail on some fisheries strategy with Ratcliff and Company as getting that information to our lobby/GR contractors should help us find opportunities. Given the time of year, direct government relations will be difficult, so it's likely we'll try to find times and dates to meet with both the governments of BC and Canada to move forward our interests on topics like housing, fisheries, taxation (property tax and income tax),
