### Progress on Achieving Key Initiatives **Citizenship Committee**

- Citizenship and Treaty Enrollment are held every first Thursday of the month.

- Working on Citizenship amendments
- Waiting to hear back on amendments to citizenship from legal counsel.
- This committee has been very active. We are currently having conversations in regard to Amendments to the Citizenship and Treaty Enrolment Act (back in February, executive council approved drafting instructions for amendments to the Act).

### Progress on Achieving Key Initiatives **Citizen Development Committee**

- Citizen development committee meetings are every third Thursday of the month.
- Kw'umut Lelum (KL) protocol agreement – Worked on a draft protocol agreement with Kw'umut Lelum a delegated agency based out of the Nanaimo -<https://www.kwumut.org>. This delegated agency covers the areas from Parksville, Nanaimo and Cowichan. Kw'umut Lelum would take over from MCFD in all the programs and the services would fall under Kw'umut Lelum. KL was very impressed with the draft PA. We will be meeting with KL after pens down to talk about next steps and hoping to bring draft to EC meeting at end of September. This will be the first of the back-and-forth meetings with KL.
- Attended Uplifting Indigenous Jurisdiction Amendments meetings.
- Met with BC Corrections to entertain the thoughts of a MOU in the month of June. As a result of this meeting, I met with Assistant Deputy Minister Lisa Anderson on July 13 to talk about letter of intent (LOI). Continued to work on BC Corrections LOI and MOU – will bring to EC after pens down for approval to sign the LOI with BC Corrections.
- K-12 at BCS will roll out starting in September.
- Things are moving along nicely with Oomiiqsu – will have a press release by end of summer early fall. BC housing has put Oomiiqsu out for bid - should hear back by end of July and those selected will be invited to move onto the RFP portion.
- Chaired our CCG (Community Consultative Group) meeting in June. I have some tentative dates set for July 18<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>. At the last meeting we recruited two more citizens for the community placing program with the RCMP. Communication has dropped off the tracks with RCMP. They haven't been present for the last two meetings. From my understanding, officer Jay has been sick and they are looking into who's replacing him and if we have received any monthly reports.
- Working on a support letter for workshop re: sexual abuse in community, which is geared more for front line workers. This workshop is an extensive 5-week workshop and will hopefully include two other First Nations - Nanaimo FN and Port Hardy. Nanaimo FN currently working on proposal for funding and will be providing support letter. There will be five seats put aside for our HFN Children and Family and Wellness team.



- Met up with Duncan Booth the morning of July 7th before the EC meeting. Duncan is a Community-Based Researcher for NTC's Covid Vaccine study team. Duncan will be working with Huu-ay-aht and Ditidaht. Meeting will be about putting forward some ideas on how he can introduce himself to the community and citizens, ha'wiih, nananaiquus and EC. ### Progress on Achieving Key Initiatives **Culture and Language**

- Cultural history nights start up in Port Alberni every Monday and the homelands every Tuesday.
- Community Language Dinners been hosted in Port Alberni and Anacla to discuss our HFN language project. Purpose of the dinner was to introduce the project and to engage/recruit our language speakers, storytellers and knowledge keepers about Huu-ay-aht history, stories and language. We received \$200k in funding from the National Indian Brotherhood for this project and we will be working with First Nations Education Foundation to initiate this project.
- Was invited by Joe Martin to witness Totem being raised in Opittsaht. It was a wonderful day and I was also able to witness to a name being given to a young man. The name he received was too-teas-mass. This name too-teas-mass is in Huuayaht as well. There is an old family connection to TFN that is 200 years old that I have yet to find.
- Attended Cultural Center/Repatriation of Treasures meeting.
- Attended Tsawak-qin sign unveiling event.
- Attended Wild about Wolves meeting with Parks Canada.
- Attended MTN/BC meeting re Heritage Conservation Act Transformation Project.

- Spent the day with and welcomed the BMSC Environmental Law Class - University of Victoria.

## **Brad Johnson Elected Council Report**

**July-August 2022**

### **Housing and Infrastructure Overview**

- There is ongoing work being done in upper Anacla within the new subdivision. I meet with the Director of Infrastructure (Charlie) every two weeks or when needed to discuss projects.
- Meetings with Barkley Group to discuss funding/grants that they can help the nation archive. We signed a contract for work that will be done with them for a community energy plan.
- A decision was made to purchase a new school bus for the growing community.
- Meeting with the strategic planner on a weekly basis.
- Attend weekly Bamfield Road update meetings.
- Address citizen concerns with rental housing. This seems to be a weekly matter.
- West Coast Trail Cabin - Throughout the summer the old cabin that we have was demolished and rebuilt. I am told by our guardians that they are very happy with the results of the finished product of the new cabin.
- 6 lots have been identified for citizens to build their own homes in upper Anacla. We have seen some interest from citizens and they are excited about this process.
- Bamfield Road Update - Work is going well on the road. Contract 3 is about 90% finished - just waiting on the toads to migrate off the road to complete the work. The work on contract 2 is also going well. A detour was put in place to keep the public traffic out of the work zones. This work is about 60% done. Contract 1 will be decided on in September if the work will continue this year. We currently have 5 citizens now working on the road project.

### **Progress on Key Initiatives:**

Maa-Nulth Nations had a very successful fishing season. We had caught all our allocated somass sockeye. We look forward to seeing how our fishmen do with the Fraser river sockeye and coho/chinook by the end of the season.

We have a MBA with the Tilbury Marine Jetty project - this agreement was amended. The new agreement gives the nation a better rate on payment.

Huu-ay-aht was awarded 2 elk this year for a draw - one being a Bull elk and the other being a cow.

ESSR fishery on the Sarita has been approved once again for this year. This means citizens can help harvest hatchery chinook and benefit with payment.

Sec87 update as of June 19<sup>th</sup> 2022.

The tax exemption will continue on an Indigenous government's former reserves and on other First Nation reserves in Canada, subject to amendments to s. 87 of the *Indian Act*, for prospective and existing status Indian modern treaty beneficiaries.

Indigenous governments have the policy choice to take up direct tax powers on their own timeline, consistent with the commitment to advance the priority of Indigenous communities to reclaim jurisdiction over tax matters.

Given the evolving nature of reconciliation arrangements and self-determination in Canada, we also sought and received a mandate to apply this new policy to scenarios where lands that were formerly First Nation reserves cease to be "reserve land", as part of reconciliation agreements (e.g., RIRSD agreements). This is very exciting news for our nation.

SGIG continue to collect data for the budget 2022 housing allocation funds. Once the data is collected in September, it will then be submitted to the federal government to look at and process how they will distribute the funds for nations for the next 5 years.

**Development Capital Raise:**

I went on another trip to Ottawa/Montreal for the DCR project. There we had several meetings with Canada Tourism, Treasury Board, Canada Council, Parks Canada, Moments Factory and Cirque De Soleil. All our meetings went very well, opening doors for funding from the federal government. What we learned was we must dial in on our asks from each department and have a main focus. An action plan will be created for funding before our next trip back east. Overall, it was a very successful trip made possible by the Honorable Sheila Copps.

The trail upgrade taskforce and the land transfer working groups are going well. A final copy of the briefing note will be submitted to the CMB for September.

July was a very busy month for me. I feel I was very productive in all my work that I took on. We went into pens down August 12<sup>th</sup> for the by-election, so I was limited to do some of my work in August. I am proud to represent our nation as a member of council and will continue doing the best I can for our people.

## **Huu-ay-aht First Nations**

### **Council Report for John Alan Jack**

#### **July, August and September 2022**

Note to Reader: Please note that roughly three weeks of July were taken up by the sudden death of my younger brother, Jackson Brian Gallagher. He was only 29 years old, and he passed away in my house as he was homeless and living with us since Winter 2021. Coupled with the vacations and the by-election that took place in August and September, activities in this trio of months are quite light compared to previous years. It picks back up again significantly in mid-September, though the activities taken up are largely due to the ACRD/UBCM, and the assignment of Capital/Development Raise and Deputy Chief-Councillor to my portfolio files. I would note that I have attempted to keep my emotional capacities in workable order, but it is likely that I may seek actual time away after the initial Autumn flurry of activities.

#### **Finance – Progress Report**

- The finance committee met on July 28<sup>th</sup> and September 23<sup>rd</sup>. We did not have a meeting in August as that would have placed it in the midst of the by-election campaign period.

#### **Finance – Emerging Issues**

[Still relevant: Of the two items from last report, the preparation for the audit and determining how HFN audit practices will affect our various Huu-ay-aht bodies like HGB, Huumiis Ventures LP, HFN Forestry Consulting Services LP, and even Tsawak-qin Forestry (TFL 44) LP. The issue is specifically how Public Sector requirements interact with private enterprise where Huu-ay-aht is either a partial owner or in full control. Our investments in TFL 44 through a special investment body is the chief concern here.]

#### **Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District – Progress Report**

The ACRD has held two Board Meetings per month like clockwork, and the agendas and notes and video recordings of those meetings can be had at [www.acrd.bc.ca](http://www.acrd.bc.ca) in addition to Committees of the Whole and regional committee meetings. In mid-September, I attended the Union of BC Municipalities Annual Convention and attended to eight BC Ministerial meetings, half ACRD and half HFN.

#### **Alberni-Clayoquot Regional District – Emerging Issues**

[Also still relevant: The previous emerging issue remains. Potentially entering into an agreement with the ACRD to provide planning, zoning and other land-use services until we can ramp up our capacity given the Bamfield road improvement. With the advent of an improved road to Bamfield, we will see an increasing need to contemplate rezoning, variances, temporary use permits and the like as our citizens and residents start building their work and their lives on our lands.

#### **Huumiis Ventures LP and HFN Forestry Consulting Services LP – Progress Report**

We worked on getting reporting materials together for RBC and EDC, as they require various updates for their records every year. By the time of this report, they are largely complete.

## Capital/Development Raise – Progress Report

As of mid-September, I have been assigned to aid the HFN team in seeking out potential investors in our territory from a tourism/hospitality/cultural perspective. Thus far, it has been several update meetings and a planned journey to Ottawa and Montreal in late September – I'll be leaving for this trip several days after submitting tis report.

## Deputy Chief-Councillor – Progress Report

I have been assigned several general tasks as delegated by our Chief-Councillor, Robert Dennis Sr. Among my tasks I have been given tasks related to (1) delegated external relations, (2) attending to the Provincial Government-to-Government Forum, (3) working with the executive director on an organizational review, (4) working with Angela Wesley on the governance project as funded by the New Relationship Trust, and (5) setting and chairing Committee of the Whole meetings. I do not have progress updates as they were recently assigned in mid-September, several days before this report was submitted.
