PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that:

Joseph Jules has made an application to the Ḥawiiḥ Council for a determination that he does not pose an unreasonable risk to public safety and that the exclusion order issued against him should be rescinded.

On September 8, 2023, Mr. Jules was convicted of the offence of assault under section 266 of the *Criminal Code*.

As a result of this conviction, an exclusion order was issued against Mr. Jules prohibiting him from being on Huu-ay-aht treaty lands.

The Ḥawiiḥ Council will be conducting a hearing to decide whether to rescind the order as Mr. Jules has asked. They may also decide keep the order in place, or to vary it. This may involve imposing conditions under which Mr. Jules may be allowed to return to treaty lands.

The following people have the right to participate in the hearing:

- Mr. Jules
- Any victims of the crimes giving rise to the order
- Mr. Jules' family and dependents

The Ḥawiiḥ Council may also decide to allow others to participate.

If you wish to participate in the hearing, please contact the Law Clerk, <u>on</u> or before April 2, 2024.

Notice of the hearing, including the date, time and location will be posted at least 14 days in advance.
