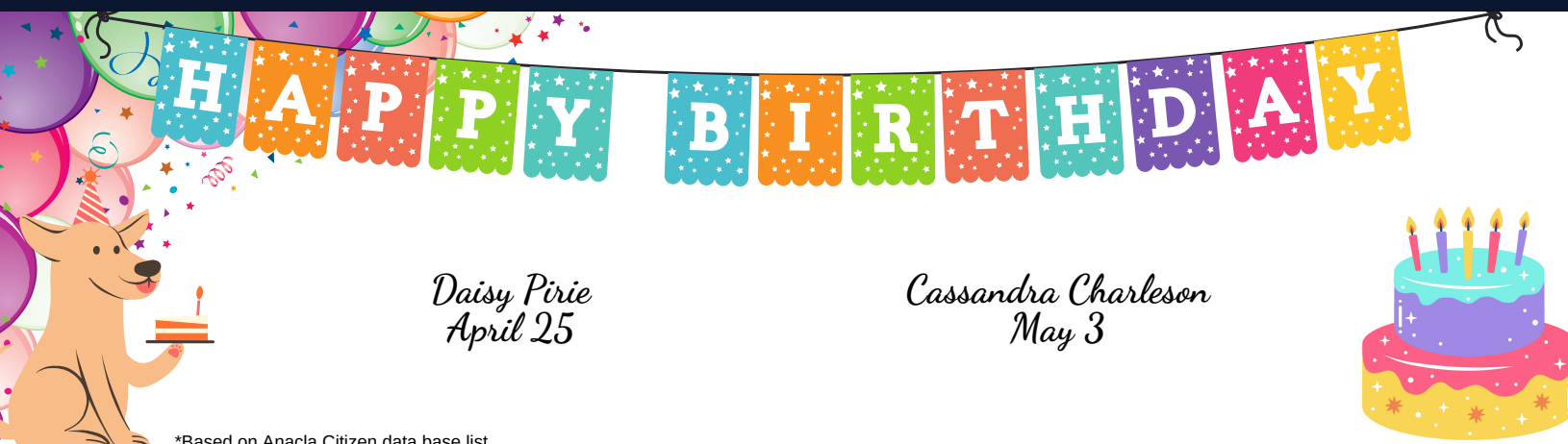
Please be advised that the Upper Anacla Playground will be closed from Thursday, April 18, until Saturday, April 20, due to the installation of the fence posts.

With the changing of the seasons means new growth! Our lands and natural resource team is preparing for another season of invasive species' removal within the territory. Our current focus is on culturally significant areas like Kixiin and the Sugsaw hatchery. Our team along with LGL is working on developing an invasive species 10-year strategic plan for the territory and crews will be out removing and monitoring species such as Hogweed, Knotweed and Scotch Broom. With spring in the air that means Scotch Broom will soon be in bloom! Keep an eye out and if you can lend a hand and cut some Broom.

We want to inform you of an essential change regarding rent payments. Effective immediately, all rent payments must be made directly to the Housing Authority and not the Nation. If you usually drop off cheques or cash, you can continue to do so at the government office as usual. We assure you that this adjustment will be smooth and easy, with minimal disruption to your usual routine.

We have attached a form below for those interested in submitting their rent via e-transfer. This option provides a streamlined and secure method for rent payment.

Housing Society E-Transfer Payment Form

The housing society is accepting rent payments by e-transfer starting April 1st 2024. This has been long awaited and requested. We are very pleased to have this option now available to make rent payments easier for all tenants.

Each tenant may only have one approved email for sending rent payments. If you lose access to the one approved email and wish to send rent through an alternative email, then you must fill out another one of these forms and reach out to the housing manager at manager@hfnha.org.

If rent is sent by an email address that is NOT on this form, it will NOT be tracked to your rental payments and you will still owe rent.

Forms may be submitted my email to the manager or dropped of at the government office for pick up. Rent is to be sent to manager@hfnha.org and is due in full at the first of each month.
